# Meeting Minutes Westerlee Community Association, Inc. September 14, 2020

The board meeting was called to order at 6:37 p.m.

Present were officers John Fox (President), Wanda Richardson (Vice President), Fred Hickok (Secretary), Mahmoodi (Treasurer), Klaus Philipsen (Past President) and board members Chris Goatee, John Herron, Pam Jarrell and Jacqui Johnson.

Remembrance of Board Member Joe Reid: Wanda said she will be ordering a plant from the board and several board members said that they will attend a celebration of his life at the funeral home. John F. added that he will miss Joe's positive outlook. Joe will be missed by all.

**Reusable Tote Bags:** Pam said that the bags will be delivered around the end of September. Several board members volunteered to assist block captains in delivering them to all the households. Rizwan suggested putting care package items, such as flashlights or hand warmers, into the bags.

**Dumpster Day:** John F. said it would from 8 to 12 on Saturday, October 31. Klaus suggested we tie it into a community cleanup of the buffer strip between Westerlee and Woodbridge Valley. Jacqui said that she will soon be ordering new posters to use to alert residents to our events.

**Holiday Decorating Contest:** Jacqui, Pam, Chris and Wanda agreed to do the judging on Wednesday, December 16 and Pam said she will get \$20 gift cards for the winners.

**Recycling Bins:** Chris passed along a request from a resident about obtaining a recycle bin. John F. said that he would be willing to make arrangements if there is enough demand and Klaus suggested doing that during the next yard sale day.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:03 p.m.

December 21 - Rare Conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn. A conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn will take place on December 21. This rare conjunction of these two planets is known as a great conjunction. The last great conjunction occurred in the year 2000. The two bright planets will appear only 7 arc minutes of each other in the night sky. They will be so close that they will appear to make a bright double planet. Look to the west just after sunset for this impressive and rare planetary pair.

January 2, 3 - Quadrantids Meteor Shower. The Quadrantids is an above average shower, with up to 40 meteors per hour at its peak. It is thought to be produced by dust grains left behind by an extinct comet known as 2003 EH1, which was discovered in 2003. Best viewing will be from a dark location after midnight. Meteors will radiate from the constellation Bootes, but can appear anywhere in the sky.

January 24 - Mercury at Greatest Eastern Elongation. The planet Mercury reaches greatest eastern elongation of 18.6 degrees from the Sun. This is the best time to view Mercury since it will be at its highest point above the horizon in the evening sky. Look for the planet low in the western sky just after sunset.


